

### Remember the Poor!

Cardinal Claudio Hummes, the Brazilian Cardinal who died on July 4th, 2022, at 87, was a great friend of Pope Francis. Pope Francis said about Cardinal Hummes in his first press conference after being elected, "He hugged me, kissed me and said: 'Do not forget about the poor.' Those words were carved on my mind." Indeed, these inspiring words of Cardinal Hummes to Pope Francis have been in the mind of Pope Francis and have been reflected in his talks, homilies, and writings. Pope Francis keeps reminding us through his actions and words that the Church is the Church of the poor and for the poor. He has emphasized through the years that the Church, which doesn't remember the poor, is the Church that does not follow the mind of Christ, who was poor himself.

The invitation to remember the poor is one of the themes the readings of this Sunday invite us to reflect on. We continued in our First reading as we read last week the book of the Prophet Amos (Amos 6: 1a, 4-7), who will know was very eloquent in condemning the negligent attitude of the rich towards the poor. These warnings of Prophet Amos connect to the Gospel story today, the story of the rich man and poor man- Lazarus (Luke 16: 19-31). The rich man in the gospel went to hell, not because of his wealth or good life but because of his sin of omission. He failed to recognize the pains of the poor man- Lazarus and only indulged in self-comfort and pleasure.

We must remember that the more blessed we are with the material things of life, the more opportunities to use them to touch the lives of people around us. The more generous we are with earthly treasures, the more spiritual treasures we store for ourselves. Maybe there are people we have made invisible, or we have already passed judgment on them regarding why they are poor or wretched, or perhaps we have not thought about different ways we can remember the poor. The poor are always around us, and we can help them in various ways. Our parish community offers us the opportunities to donate to our food pantry, through which we serve the poor in our neighborhood and beyond. Let us pray that in the comforts of our lives, we do not forget the discomforts and pains of people around us. Amen.

**Q. Why are our priests initials missing from the masses?** A. There are times when the Presider Schedule is not available prior to sending the bulletin to print.

We've been thinking about names lately, and there is hardly any tradition older than changing one's name when accepting a new vocation in life. In the time of Jesus, people would normally wait until the eighth day after birth for the naming of a child, partly because of the fragility of infant life, when the eighth day would mark the end of a survival crisis, and also because the elders would look for some clues as to the child's identity. In Jewish life then as now, it was not the custom to name a child after a living parent; notice there are no "juniors" in the genealogy of Jesus.

Remember also how the relatives complained to Zachary and Elizabeth that no one in their family was ever named John.

Then there are the changed names, Abram became Abraham, Sarai became Sarah, Saul became Paul, Simon became Peter. This spills over into Western culture in many ways, such as British royalty taking new names at coronation. It's anybody's guess, for example, whether the Prince of Wales intends to be King Charles II, or become Henry, or Edward, or George if he wishes.

Members of religious orders have until recent years swapped baptismal names for new ones, and the latest pope made a switch as well. Secular life has many parallels, and movie stars like Cary Grant, Judy Garland, and John Wayne might not have shone so brightly as Archie Leach, Frances Gumm, and Marion Morrison.

There are some compelling reasons in our tradition for taking a new name when undertaking a new mission, yet also a clear preference for choosing the right baptismal name from the start!




### Read Gospel weeklies with your children in a more engaging way.

Gospel Weeklies from Pflaum, the program that we use for our Catechetical Program offers great resources to support parents in bringing the Word of God to the family discussion.

This Sunday's Gospel challenges us to be selfless and care for others who need help. Jesus tells a story of a poor beggar named Lazarus who lived outside the gates of a Rich Man's house. Lazarus' requests for help were ignored for years. Lazarus finally found comfort in Heaven once he had died. The Rich Man passed away and suffered in Hell. The Rich Man begged Abraham for mercy, just as Lazarus had once begged the Rich Man. Abraham reprimanded the Rich Man for his actions during his lifetime and for not heeding the warnings in Scripture. Jesus reminds us that we have been provided with all of the resources in our lives to understand God's desire for us to serve one another. Take time this week to reflect on steps your family can take to become more aware of the ways you can share God's love with other people.

**Good News (Grades 2-3):** This week's lesson taught the importance of being aware of other people's needs. The class learned about Saint Francis of Assisi's encounter with a leper. The class also presented a play of the Rich Man and the Beggar. What were the consequences of the Rich Man's lack of awareness of the Beggar's needs? How could the Rich Man have benefitted from being aware of God's word? Ask your child to tell you what he or she is good at. Discuss how your child can use his or her gifts to help others who may be gifted in different ways.

**Venture (Grades 4-6):** The class began by reading a series of interviews about Saint Francis' conversion to Christianity. Saint Francis of Assisi changed his life after encountering others who needed help. The young people then read the Gospel reading of the Rich Man and Lazarus. How could the Rich Man have treated Lazarus when they were both alive? What does Jesus want us to learn from this Gospel story? How can your young person avoid growing complacent?

**Visions (Grades 7-9):** Ask your youngster to recount the story of Marcus and Jalen. Discuss what clues did Marcus miss that indicated his friend was hungry. How could Marcus have handled the situation better? Cont. next column

Compare the story of Marcus and Jalen to the Gospel passage of the Rich Man and Lazarus. Talk to your young person about how we can avoid becoming complacent. What can we do to open our eyes and be more aware of the needs of others? Pray Together Have each family member use his or her own words to pray for those who feel left out by their friends, families, and communities. Brainstorm ways your family can work toward helping those who will benefit from your love.

I want to thank the many families that have come forward to volunteer to support the hot lunch program, help in the schoolyard, or be a part of a committee or an event. Your support has been invaluable. We are so grateful to each of you.

Parent/Family engagement is critical to the success of our school and parish. We are called to serve as we walk our faith journey. We also recognize that many are still impacted by Covid concerns and may have a limited capacity to volunteer. For these reasons, mandating school service hours is inappropriate. For the 2022-23 school year, there will be no penalties for families who can not complete the required 20 service hours that were included in the school contract. Without parent volunteers in these areas, we must fill these gaps with hired help or eliminate programs. Service to our community is invaluable. Please get involved where you can or in an activity that calls you, even if it is not one of the school's critical areas of need.

The time you give to attending events or serving the SFC community is essential. Without it, we can not build upon our foundation. My goal is to create a culture where we give our time, treasure, and talent because we can understand that God has called us to love and serve one another.
