### Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we hear once again of the deep connection between Jesus and Israel’s prophets. In the reading from Jeremiah, God’s curses at the opening are counterbalanced by God’s blessings in the second part. In Luke’s version of the Beatitudes, Jesus begins with blessings, then counterbalances with a “woe” section. The point is clear: the way we live our lives has a direct connection to whether we will experience curses and woes, or blessings instead. Of course, being among God’s blessed ones (in Latin, *beati*, from which “beatitudes” comes) doesn’t necessarily mean a life free of woe. Jesus, in his fully human nature, knew this. He also knew that when we seek happiness through our own devices, and trust only in ourselves, the woes are guaranteed to come. Let us follow the wisdom of Jeremiah and Jesus, along with the opening of the book of Psalms (echoed by Jeremiah today): “blessed are the ones who trust in the Lord.”

### I DON’T KNOW

There are times when the smartest, but most difficult, thing we can say is, “I don’t know.” While we often think of this as a sign of weakness, the amount of humility it takes to say this means that the word of God is alive and well in us. To say “I don’t know” means that we look outside of ourselves to learn, and to find those who do know, and — ultimately — accept that we have to look to others and to God to help us, to guide us through life. To place our trust and hope only in this world, Paul tells the Corinthians (and us!), makes us people to be pitied. Jesus echoes this in the “woes” section of Luke’s Beatitudes, when he points out that trusting in earthly wealth, full bellies, entertainments, and reputation will, eventually, not be enough when we are called beyond this life.

### LOOK ‘EM IN THE EYE

Prior to delivering the blessings and woes of his “Sermon on the Plain” in Luke, Jesus had been on top of a mountain in prayer, after which he selected the Twelve to go on his mission with him. Coming down from the mountain, the first thing Jesus does is show them what is at the heart of his — and their — mission: preaching to the multitude, healing all who were in need of it, no matter where they had come from. Luke then carefully notes that Jesus raises his eyes, not to look toward heaven again in prayer, but he raises his eyes to look directly at his disciples, to share the message of blessings and woes. This scene echoes Moses coming down from the mountain to give Israel its command as to how they should live in God’s covenant. As followers of Jesus today, we are called to live out his mission to the world, while we also look beyond this world to trust in God, our only hope.



## **SFC Food Pantry: How You Can Help**

At St. Frances Cabrini, we always find a way to feed those in our community. Having food is wonderful but having a way to open the canned food; being able to eat it with utensils is all the better. To feel clean and ready for the day is important as well!



Saint Frances Cabrini Food Pantry needs toiletries. We kindly ask for newly packaged feminine hygiene items, shaving cream, razors, toothbrushes, toothpaste, mouthwash, moist towelettes, toilet paper, washcloths, small shampoos, combs, etc. Solid staples such as oatmeal, peanut butter, jam, jellies, sugar free Jello, salt, pepper, napkins, canned foods with POP TOPS when possible, can openers are needed too. Consider donating the following items to help complete a meal. Powdered milk, cooking oil, salt & pepper, spices, Stove Top stuffing, tea bags or coffee, sugar & flour, crackers, small potatoes, cake mix & frosting, dish soap, salt and pepper shakers, napkins.

As we gear up for a new year, we hope to serve our community as best we can. This ministry would not be able to help those in our local community were it not for the gracious help of our parishioners. The parish office is open Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays and we are happy to receive these items on those days. We ask that the toiletries are packaged from the store. No clothing will be accepted. There are groups that we work with outside of our food program here though and if you wish, you can call **Jean O'Connell** in the parish office at **408-879 1120 ext 20** to arrange for pick-up of warm clothing, coats and blankets. These will in turn be donated to groups who work with the homeless and those in need of staying warm this winter.




### **"Tolton: From Slave to Priest"**

Meet America's first Black Priest, Venerable Father Augustus Tolton, in this audio drama adapted from our live stage production.



The drama opens with nine-year-old Augustus Tolton's harrowing escape from slavery to freedom. In a leaky boat with bullets whizzing overhead, his mother courageously rows the family across the Mississippi River. They settle in the town of Quincy, Illinois, where hardships and persecution continue to afflict them. Despite all this, Augustus perseveres in his deep desire to become a Catholic priest. Rejected by all U.S. seminaries, he is finally ordained in Rome. When he returns to America, he tirelessly serves people of all races, especially the former slaves who flock to Chicago.

If you are on Faith Direct, we have made it simpler. SFC has exchanged the wording from St. Vincent de Paul to St. Frances Cabrini Food Outreach. For those that were giving to St. Vincent de Paul on Faith Direct, you don't need to do anything. The donations will continue, just to SFC food donation instead.

During the interim of the change, SFC had a temporary one-time fund for "food donations." If you contributed to that, it will still appear on your year-end tax letter. That number has now been deactivated, so no further contributions will go to the temporary number.
