

## The Incarnation: God's Great Mystery of Salvation!

The Incarnation, God's great mystery of salvation—God's taking on human flesh and human life—means more than the Second Person of the Trinity's entrance into human history, suffering, and death. Much of the New Testament reflection on this mystery describe it in terms of solidarity: the reality that "God is with us," a fact made manifest in the name Emmanuel, first given by the prophet Isaiah. God shows that solidarity in a more radical way than God's accompanying Israel from slavery in Egypt through the Red Sea, through the desert, through the establishment in the land of promise. God's solidarity with us touches all things human—through temptation to forgiveness, through death to life.

The Incarnation means more than that. It divinizes humanity. God's joining the divine to the human is not a one-way street. It also joins the human to the divine and, in many ways, completes the work of creation. What is good at creation becomes perfect in Christ Jesus. And yet, unbelievably, there is more. The Incarnation also means that God wants us to participate in our salvation. God grants us salvation but gives us a role, too. Isaiah tells how God asks Ahaz to accept a role—to ask for a sign—but the king was too hesitant. Even so, God gave the sign in the words of the prophet. Centuries later, at the time of fulfillment, God invites Mary and Joseph to accept their roles. Luke's Gospel narrates the invitation to Mary and her response, "Be it done to me according to your will." In Matthew's Gospel, we hear Joseph's response, "As the angel of the Lord had commanded him, he took his wife into his home." In a mysterious way, God's plan for the Incarnation rested on the work of this humble couple of Nazareth.





### GOD WANTS TO BE ONE WITH US

What great lengths God will go to in loving and saving us! Think of the most outlandish circumstance you might conceive. That seems to be what the Lord is saying to Ahaz in today's first reading. "A virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel." Not only is the idea of a virgin conceiving beyond comprehension in Ahaz's time, so would the concept of God wanting to be with us be, as the name Emmanuel indicates. And yet, this is what we celebrate in the Incarnation—God wants so completely to be one with us that God came to be with us in a son born to a virgin, the Blessed Virgin Mary. There is more to this story than even these amazing and outlandish occurrences, however. God wants to be one with us so deeply that God partners with us to make God's presence known.

**St. Frances Cabrini - The Truth to Inspire**

Francesca Cabrini was born on July 15, 1850, in the village of Sant' Angelo, on the outskirts of Lodi, about twenty miles from Milan, in the pleasant, fertile Lombardy plain. She was the thirteenth child of a farmer's family, her father Agostino being the proprietor of a modest estate. The home into which she was born was a comfortable, attractive place for children, with its flowering vines, its gardens, and animals; but its serenity and security was in strong contrast with the confusion of the times.

Italy had succeeded in throwing off the Austrian yoke and was moving towards unity. Agostino and his wife Stella were conservative people who took no part in the political upheavals around them, although some of their relatives were deeply concerned in the struggle, and one, Agostino Depretis, later became prime minister. Sturdy and pious, the Cabrinis were devoted to their home, their children, and their Church. Signora Cabrini was fifty-two when Francesca was born, and the tiny baby seemed so fragile at birth that she was carried to the church for baptism at once.

No one would have ventured to predict then that she would not only survive but live out sixty-seven extraordinarily active and productive years. Villagers and members of the family recalled later that just before her birth a flock of white doves circled around high above the house, and one of them dropped down to nestle in the vines that covered the walls.

The father took the bird, showed it to his children, then released it to fly away.

However, I would like to share a nice story related to the Advent wreath; a tradition that the Church adopted as part of our spiritual preparation for Christmas.

Our Catholic Tradition uses many symbols to represent many things related to our faith. The Advent wreath and candles are also full of symbolism tied to the season of preparation. The wreath is made of various evergreens in a circular shape, which signifies continuous life; there is no beginning or end, symbolizing the eternity of God's presence in humans' lives, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life that God promised through Christ. The individual evergreens have their meanings too, that can be applied to our faith. The laurel signifies victory over suffering. The pine, holly, and yew represent immortality, and the cedar signifies strength and healing.

The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday. Three of the candles are purple because violet is a liturgical color that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice.

Here is a good story about a little girl, which we could all learn from.

A little girl walks into a dark room that would be scary dark if there were no four beautiful burning candles in it. Instead of being afraid, she walks in with a smile on her face as she stares at the beauty and the bright light of the four candles.

Suddenly, one of the candles speaks:

"I am **PEACE**. But with all the violence on our streets and places where we live, there is no more peace in the world, and I cannot survive." So, the candle of Peace is extinguished.

Then the second candle looks at the girl and speaks:

"I am **LOVE**. But I am sad to see so many signs of hatred in our lives, discrimination, hurtful words and actions exchanged with one another, broken relationships among couples and families, and selfishness growing in our society. I cannot survive." So, the second candle is blown away.

The third candle, with the pessimistic expression, speaks:

I am **JOY**. But look around us; there is sadness, illness, poverty, homelessness, abortions, hunger, war, and racial injustice; I, too, cannot survive." So, following the first two candles, it goes away in smoke.

Now, the little girl starts to feel afraid, tears rolling down her face as the room darkens. While she begins to walk out the door, another voice stops her. The fourth candle speaks:

"Little girl, do not be afraid." She turns to see the only candle left there; the candle continues speaking, "I am **HOPE**. Please use my light to burn the other candles that have been extinguished."

The little girl starts to light all the other candles, the darkness is gone, the beauty is restored, and the smile returns to her face.

**"As long as there is hope, there will be Peace, Love, and Joy in the world."**


