

I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. - Philippians 4:13

In any good story, the author gives a hint at the beginning – a clue about how the story will resolve itself. At the outset of his gospel account St. Matthew records that when John the Baptist observes Jesus he announces: "There is the Lamb of God!" Within the Christian faith, the lamb of God has become a powerful symbol. Our attention is drawn to the sacrifice of lambs and to their innocence and purity. Jesus was without sin - the perfect lamb whose sacrifice offers forgiveness and redemption.

Perhaps John was proclaiming: "Your prophets dreamed of the one who was to love and suffer and die for the people; that one has come." It was suddenly revealed to John that Jesus was none other than the Son of God. Jesus became a lamb led to the slaughter to show the depth of God's love for us. Our response to this overture of God's love for us in Jesus is to love like He did. Sin is the opposite - we fail to love. When we say "I have sinned" – it's not that we have broken a rule, a regulation, a law – it is the breaking of another person's heart. We have broken a person, we have nailed him to the cross.

For this reason, the Agnus Dei is sung during the breaking of the consecrated Host at Mass. St. John Chrysostom (d. 407) preached of how this breaking symbolized the Passion of Jesus – how He suffered for us, and also how his sacrificial death is a victory. This triumph is further emphasized when the priest holds up the fractured Host and says, "This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Happy are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb."

When we celebrate the mysteries of the Mass, we look to the Lamb who suffered, died, and rose for our salvation. We gather around the altar of the Lamb, offering to Him our hearts and pledging our love, so that we may welcome Him and become united to Him in the Holy Eucharist. Agnus Dei!

Why lay leadership?

The Second Vatican Council called for the full and active participation of the faithful. In his apostolic exhortation Christifidelis Laici (January 1989), Pope John Paul II writes: "the lay faithful must take an active, conscious, and responsible part in the mission of the Church." The Institute for Leadership in Ministry serves to prepare members of the Catholic laity from the Diocese of San Jose for leadership in the Church.

What is the Institute?

The Institute's core program is a three-year course of studies which provides a foundation in Catholic theology, spirituality, education and training in leadership.

Foundational to the Institute is that all are called by virtue of baptism, to use our gifts to build the Reign of God. Those whose talents include the ability to lead must be theologically trained and

pastorally formed. The Institute has trained individuals for leadership in the Diocese of San Jose since 1997.

In addition to the core program, the Institute shares the responsibility for the Advanced Lay Leadership Formation and the training and formation of Permanent Deacons. **Reconciliation** is held in the church library **every Saturday** from 3:30pm to 4:30pm, and on the **First Friday** of each month during **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament**, from 9:30 to 10:30am and again at 5:30 PM to 6:30 PM.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

Calendars

Perhaps you noticed that this year we didn't celebrate the Baptism of the Lord on the Sunday after Epiphany (today), but instead on last Monday, the day after Epiphany. Why the shift? It all has to do with regional calendars. Within certain general boundaries, every national conference of bishops is able to set its own liturgical calendar according to how it is felt to benefit the people in that region most. So, for example, the Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated January 6 on the Church's universal calendar. But the bishops of the United States decided that, for the benefit of the faithful, it would be better for Epiphany to be celebrated on a Sunday every year.

So here in the States we see Epiphany's date vary from January 2 to January 8. The biggest problem this presents is that the Baptism of the Lord, which is normally celebrated on the Sunday after the Epiphany, would push back the whole liturgical calendar by a week on the years when the Sunday celebration of the Epiphany falls on January 7 or 8, putting the U.S. out of sync with the rest of the Catholic world at least until Lent. To avoid that scenario, the U. S. bishops decreed that in those years the Baptism of the Lord would fall on the Monday after Epiphany, leaving the rest of the calendar intact. © J. S. 



Baptism is a mystery of God's love.

The New Year is a time that many of us use to restructure our lives. We reorganize priorities and we make resolutions and construct plans for what we want to achieve in the coming year; we take the changing of the year as an opportune time point to 'reset' our lives in order to reach new goals.

But when is the 'reset' point for us as Christians? Yup! Many of us will answer "It's the day when we were baptized". If given the time to sit and reflect on our lives going from one year to the next, I think we all could agree that life is very much a mystery. We create plans and take actions to enact those plans to achieve our goals. But we are seldom certain if our plans will go the way we expect or desire. The good thing is, even though we know that life is a mystery, if we carefully make the necessary preparations to execute our plans, we have enough confidence to generate expectations. Making plans to achieve goals involves using the resources we have (talents, strengths, knowledge, materials, people around us, etc.). The more we utilize accessible resources to achieve our goals, the more often we can attain our goals, or at the very least get closer to them.

The same ideas can be applied to Baptism. Baptism is a mystery for each one of us. In theology we understand that the Baptism is God's gift to free us from original sin. Being baptized also means a way to say yes to God's love.

We answered yes to our baptisms; we answered yes to be called "children of God"; we answered yes to be Christ followers. We responded to God's call.

Through the Baptism, we received the gift of the Holy Spirit, who is with us at all times, ready to lead us to walk in the new life. With the Holy Spirit in us, we are gifted with many resources that we can use to reach our goals as children of God. We are loved by God in every way. Through grace that is freely given to us, we have faith that everything will eventually be good in our lives.

Without God's love, we are nothing. God's love is what enables us to live, to love, and to do good in the world. For this, we need to exercise our gratitude for being Catholic. We can only truly be thankful once we realize that we can do nothing without God. Baptism means we receive the call to be Christ follower. We are plunged into the intriguing mystery of the incarnation of God in Jesus. Baptism is not just one social or family gathering event. It is God's work of showing love to humanity. It defines who we are as Christians. It challenges us to be true to our calling, to follow Jesus daily with the help of the Holy Spirit, to live every day for the glory of the Father, to live every day as a member of the Catholic Church, for each of us to live as Catholics.

Let us make our new year resolution as Christ followers, to achieve our goals as Christians by using the gift of the Spirit who is already in us.




JANUARY DATE NIGHT- THE VIRTUES for COUPLES


