## Life of Blessedness!

I had the opportunity to visit my family in Nigeria and began the new year with them. We had our family prayer for the new year. We prayed for different intentions, especially for peace, harmony, and respect for human life in my home country Nigeria. I remember one of my nephews praying that the year 2023 brings us joy, happiness, and God's love- the life of Blessedness, an important theme we reflect on the readings of this Sunday. Thus, Prophet Zephaniah (2:3;3:12-13), in the first reading, invites us to this life of Blessedness through these inspiring words, "Seek the LORD, all you humble of the earth, who have observed his law, seek justice, seek humility."

The words of the beatitudes in the Gospel (Matthew 5:1-12) invite us in different ways to live this life of Blessedness. God's blessings are given to each of us, and we need to work hard to live out the virtues that lead us to this Blessedness or happiness listed in the beatitudes. The model of joy presented in the beatitudes is contrary to what we see and hear today. Each of us can ask ourselves, of these lists of beatitudes, which one is God calling you to live out most in your life and in your relationship with him and others. Is God calling you to be poor in spirit-humble, meek, pure in heart, merciful, thirst for righteousness, or persevere in doing good? Therefore, let us ask the good Lord to help us live the beatitudes that will lead us to a life of Blessedness here and hereafter. Amen.

### THE PEOPLE OF GOD'S KINGDOM

Jesus invites us to be people with open hearts, to receive God's blessing. And working through us, God may bless all of creation.

**Into Life: Love Changes Everything****Summoned to Life: Spiritual Foundations | Into Life**

In the first video, “Summoned to Life: Spiritual Foundations,” participants explore what it means to be created by God, in his image and likeness. In his goodness, God calls each human person into existence with infinite intention, care, and love. Every human person is a gift. Recognizing the gift of each person can be difficult because we live in a world that tells us our worth only comes from what we can do, produce, or achieve. This can lead to anxiety, fear, confusion, isolation, addiction, and even death. Every person is summoned not only to recognize him/herself as a gift but also to help others experience themselves as a gift.

**The Beatitudes for families –  
questions to reflect together in your family.**

**1. “Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.”**

The poor include both literally poor people, in need of basic necessities, and those who are aware of their spiritual poverty, people who acknowledge their need for God. The reward mentioned here is the joy in kingdom of heaven. What do we consider to be our family's greatest riches?

**2. “Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.”**

Those who are sad or experiencing a loss of any kind. Jesus promises comfort for those who suffer. When we suffer, we have a choice to make: we can become bitter, or we can become more compassionate to others in pain. How do we find comfort in our family?

**3. “Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.”**

The meek are humble and patient people. A person who chooses other ways to resolve conflicts without hurting others is meek. The reward is great spiritual wealth. How do we resolve conflict in our families?

**4. “Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.”**

This blessing is for people who hunger for justice in our world. Children have a great capacity to see wrongs and often possess a simple view of complex issues. Perhaps our kids can use their creativity to solve some of the local injustices in schools and communities.

**5. “Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.”**

Mercy has many meanings: forgiveness, kindness, compassion. It is easier to extend mercy to others when you begin with yourself. In our family, rather than keeping track of mistakes, we try to see God's grace among us.

**6. “Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.”**

Those who see God, and there is nothing clouding their vision! The clean of heart can also be people who single-mindedly see God first in all situations and people.

**7. “Blessed are the peacemakers; they will be called children of God.”**

Jesus asks us all to be peacemakers; we are, after all, children of God. As his children, we must continue to work for unity and understanding. Family is the place which we learn peacemaking skills. Peace begins at home.

**8. “Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.”**

It can be difficult to do what is right, such as standing up to someone who is acting like a bully. But we learn from Jesus, and, through practice in our family, we see that doing the right thing is what it really means to be a follower of Jesus.



There are no African-American Saints formally recognized within the Catholic Church, but that could soon change. There are six incredible black men and women who are on the path to Canonization. The Catholic Church is starting to recognize their impact and may soon name any or all of them Saints. It's time to hear their stories.

### Venerable Pierre Toussaint

Born enslaved, Toussaint gained success as a hairdresser and used his resources to serve the poor.

### Servant of God Mother Mary Lange

Lange was the founder of the Oblate Sisters of Providence and the first African-American superior of any religious order.

### Venerable Henriette Delille

Legally unable to join a religious order because of her African heritage, Delille started the Sisters of the Holy Family, an order that still ministers to people today.

### Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton

Tolton escaped slavery and traveled to Rome to become ordained. He was the first African-American priest in the United States.


### Servant of God Julia Greeley

Greeley was an enslaved woman who became free, converted to Catholicism, and consecrated her life to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

### Servant of God Sr. Thea Bowman

Bowman converted to Catholicism as a child, became a nun, and spent her life singing, teaching, and preaching to promote devotion to Christ.
