Persevering in the Lord!

This Sunday, November 13, is the feast day of our Patroness, St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850-1917). One of the enduring and endearing virtues of St. Frances Cabrini is the exemplary way she persevered in the Lord. When she landed in America on March 31, 1889, from Italy, her home country, at the age of 39, she faced difficulties but overcame them through her perseverance in the Lord. She chose as her motto the words of St. Paul, “I can do all things in Him (Christ) who strengthens me” (Philippians 4:13). These faith-filled words motivated and compelled her to live an amazing life of faith through perseverance in the Lord. Hence, by the time she died at 67, she had already opened 67 institutions, including hospitals, orphanages, and schools.

As we come closer to the end of the liturgical year, the readings of this Sunday, invite us to persevere in the Lord. In our first reading, Prophet Malachi (Malachi 3:19-20), in a very brief way, describes to us the reward of perseverance, “for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays.” The Gospel of Luke (Luke 21:5-9) describes the events of the last days, which are not far-fetched from the natural and human disasters we see and hear these days. In all these, the gospel ended by inviting us to persevere in the Lord, “By your perseverance, you will secure your lives.” Similarly, writing to the Thessalonians (2 Thessalonians 3:7-12) during their confusion regarding the second coming of Jesus, St. Paul encouraged them as he is encouraging us today to continue to persevere in our work for God’s glory.

God has given us the freedom to accept or reject the gift of salvation he has given us in Christ. He patiently calls on us through different life opportunities to accept and embrace this gift with its challenges. God wants us to say yes to this through our perseverance continuously. The challenges of perseverance come in the face of difficulty and disappointments in life, but that is when we have the test of our faith in God, who will not fail us if we trust in him. Therefore, let us pray for the gifts of wisdom and courage we need to persevere in the Lord. Let these words of St. Paul uplift us, “With all prayer and supplication, pray at every opportunity in the Spirit. To that end, be watchful with all perseverance and supplication” (Ephesians 6:18). Amen.

We want to thank those who participated in our different activities in honor of our feast day. We started as a parish community (school & parish) to celebrate this special day in the life of our SFC community through a week-long activity, which comprises spiritual, devotional, liturgical, cultural, academic, and social activities to mark this year's feast day. I hope we appreciated the beauty of the diversity of our parish community through the celebration of our Intercultural Mass and reception. We thank the Cabrini planning committee: Fr. Vincent, Doris Bebla, Ronda Clark, Maile Figone, Cathy Campbell, Lee Campbell, Merry Kaelani, Teresa Adams, Audrey Piedad, and all the volunteers who came out to help in different ways.

Treasures from Our Tradition

We are faced with strong and disturbing readings today that hold a certain fascination, since they seem at first glance to be blueprints for future inevitable wars and hardship. A fundamentalist interpretation focuses on this aspect. Yet we hear them at our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, which infuses them with hope and optimism. Rather than dreading the future, today's liturgy assures us that God is with us in all of life's inevitable trials, and that we have a role in shaping the outcome of human history. Occasionally, some Christians have attempted to decode these readings for an exact measure of the world's end, but they have thus far been disappointed.

"Nothing lasts forever" is a lyric from a Broadway show. Stars fall from the sky, leaves wither and fall, mountains wash into the sea, human projects and governments totter and collapse with great regularity. Today's liturgy opposes this idea as incomplete, reminding us that Christ has made a permanent change in human history, and that life in him is life forever. Rather than inviting us to throw in the towel, today's liturgy strengthens us for acts of goodness and grace in our families, communities, and world.



St. Frances Cabrini (1850-1917)

Feast Day: November 13th

Did you know that Mother Cabrini did not leave Italy until the age of 39, but she lived 67 years and founded 67 institutions: schools, hospitals, and orphanages?



Though her health was always precarious, she relentlessly worked to minister to the needs she saw around her. In the late 1800's, Italians were greatly discriminated against in the United States. In the Catholic community they were often excluded and forced to worship in church basements. Few Italian priests or religious were available, and many Italian immigrants lost their faith. Mother Cabrini and her sisters went to where people were, speaking their language, bringing their culture, and reminding people that God was still with them in their new land. Some of her lesser-known missionary work included going into dangerous mine shafts in Colorado to pray with Italian miners isolated from their families and praying with prison inmates immediately before their execution. Mother Cabrini teaches us that we can become holy in the ordinary circumstances in which we live our lives by responding to the concrete needs we see around us. Cabrini died of complications from malaria at age 67 in Columbus Hospital in Chicago on December 22, 1917. She is the first U.S. citizen to be canonized as a saint on July 7, 1946. She is the patroness of all the immigrants.

Cabrini High School students floated paper boats filled with “missionary” violets in Bayou St. John mimicking one of Mother Cabrini’s childhood past-times as part of the week of events commemorating her Feast Day on November 13th. The students made paper boats filled with “missionary” violets and sending them out into the world to spread good and do God’s work. The students floated their boats in Bayou St. John across from the school, honoring Mother Cabrini and one of the school’s cores values – service to others.



From an early age, Mother Cabrini had a great devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. As she grew older, her faith continued to grow, and she longed to become a missionary and go to China.

She was not accepted into any religious community because of her frail health, but she never lost faith. She founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the first missionary order for women in the Catholic Church.

As a young girl, Mother Cabrini made her own paper boats, filled them with purple violets and floated them in the stream near her home. The flowers represented missionaries she imagined sending them out to do good in the world, traveling to help those that were poor and most vulnerable. Even though she was afraid of water, she crossed the oceans many times to help make her dream a reality throughout the world. You will even find many of her institutions near a body of water.


