## Pray in Humility!

***"If you have lost the taste for prayer, you will regain the desire for it by returning humbly to its practice" (St. Pope Paul VI).***

The Eucharistic celebration (Mass) is the sacrament of God's mercy. At different times within the Mass, we ask for God's forgiveness because we believe, as we profess in the Creed, "the forgiveness of sin" and affirm our human frailty and the reality of sin. Last Sunday, we read the first part of Luke's Gospel chapter 18 on the parable of the persistent widow and wicked judge, through which we were called to reflect on the importance of praying with perseverance and persistence. The second part of Luke's Gospel chapter 18 invites us to reflect on our attitude in prayer through the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector.

Jesus, through today's Gospel of Luke (18:9-14), teaches us how we should pray and how not to pray: Avoiding self-justification and judging others in prayer. Today's first reading, the book of Sirach (35:12-14; 16 -18), one of the wisdom books, reminds us of the importance of praying in humility, "... the prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it does not rest till it reaches its goal, nor will it withdraw till the Most High responds..." In addition, in today's second reading (2 Timothy 4:6-8,16-18), St. Paul, in the last part of his letter to Timothy in a prayerful way, sets a good example for us. He offered a prayer of inclusiveness and forgiveness.

Praying in humility reminds us that our prayer should not be time for self-defense, self-justification, self-appraisal, or justification, but more of thanksgiving and asking for mercy. The problem with the prayer of the Pharisee in the Gospel was that he used his prayer time to judge and condemn the Tax Collector, which is a mark of pride. From the Tax Collector in the Gospel, we learn the importance of praying in humility as a model of prayer. Praying in humility is also an act of faith. It calls to our mind that our prayer should reflect our total dependence on God and our openness to receive the mercy of God, which is infinite and definite. Let us always remember these words of Jesus that conclude today's Gospel, "whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Amen.

### MADE RIGHT BEFORE GOD

Although the opening lines of today's first reading claim that the Lord "knows no favorites" (Sirach 35:15) and is "not unduly partial toward the weak" (35:16), the remainder of the passage makes it clear that the Lord does indeed pay special attention to the weak, the oppressed, and the orphans and widows. The psalmist reiterates: "The Lord hears the cry of the poor" (see Psalm 34:18). In the Gospel, Jesus claims that a tax collector is more justified in his prayer for mercy than the Pharisee, whose prayer was an account of his own righteous deeds. Jesus' point could not have been clearer: tax collectors in the Jewish society of Jesus' day were not just lowly; they were considered outcasts and cheaters. They collected taxes for the hated Romans and almost certainly collected enough to assure a generous income for themselves. Tax collectors were among society's outcasts; didn't this one just admit his own sinfulness? How could a tax collector be "justified" (that is, made right) before God, while the Pharisee was not? Why would God even listen to the prayer of a tax collector? This surely was a surprise, upsetting common assumptions about righteousness.

Did you know that Mother Cabrini did not leave Italy until the age of 39, but she lived 67 years and founded 67 institutions: schools, hospitals, and orphanages?

Though her health was always precarious, she relentlessly worked to minister to the needs she saw around her. In the late 1800's, Italians were greatly discriminated against in the United States. In the Catholic community they were often excluded and forced to worship in church basements. Few Italian priests or religious were available, and many Italian immigrants lost their faith. Mother Cabrini and her sisters went to where people were, speaking their language, bringing their culture, and reminding people that God was still with them in their new land. Some of her lesser-known missionary work included going into dangerous mine shafts in Colorado to pray with Italian miners isolated from their families and praying with prison inmates immediately before their execution. Mother Cabrini teaches us that we can become holy in the ordinary circumstances in which we live our lives by responding to the concrete needs we see around us.


**All Souls' Candle Procession**

**CHRISTUS VIVIT****POPE FRANCIS' LETTER TO YOUNG PEOPLE**

“Christus Vivit” is the first-ever Vatican document on young people.

Below are a few key themes of “Christus Vivit.”

APOSTOLIC EXHORTATION  
**POPE FRANCIS**

**1. Jesus was a young person.**

Pope Francis writes, “It is important to realize that Jesus was a young person. He gave his life when he was, in today’s terms, a young adult” - # 23.

This is a beautiful line for all young people to pray through Jesus, our savior. Jesus took on human flesh and walked among us. He grew up and lived as a young person and even gave his life at the age of 33, as young adult man. As Christians, we are called to imitate Jesus. This is a call to total self-giving; it is not something that we should wait to answer until we are old, but something that especially starts in our youth. Pope Francis is inviting the youth of the today to live with that same sacrificial love.

**2. We’re called to return to the source of youth.**

Pope Francis reminds us that being transformed in Christ is the source of the youthfulness of the Church. As he says:

Young people are called to be leaven in the world — but we cannot be leaven without first being filled with Christ. We need to turn repeatedly to attending Mass, praying daily, reading the Bible and asking for Mary’s intercession. It is here that we will find the strength to be ever renewed in Christ and be a joyful presence in the world.

The Holy Father says that “we must dare to be different, to point to ideals other than those of this world” #36. Our ability to point to these ideals comes from Christ, and only in Jesus will the human heart find peace, joy and freedom.

**3. Be a saint.**

“May these and so many other young people who perhaps in silence and hiddenness lived the Gospel to the full, intercede for the Church, so that she may be full of joyous, courageous and committed young people who can offer the world new testimonies of holiness” # 63.

We live in a time that needs saints more than ever. There are many challenges of our times in and outside of the Church — but these crises can only be addressed by living out a holy life. Now is the time to be holy: We cannot put this on our “someday, maybe” list. Holiness cannot wait. God created each of us to
