

I Believe in the Resurrection of the Dead!

The celebrations of the Feasts of All the Saints and All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) on 1st and 2nd November, respectively, are very significant as we come towards the end of the Liturgical Year. Through these celebrations, we remember our loved ones who have departed from this life. Also, these celebrations remind us of the transient nature of our earthly life. They invite us to seize our opportunities to embrace the gratuitous gift of salvation, which God has given us in Christ and which we solemnly accept whenever we profess in our Creed, I Believe in the Resurrection of the Dead! The resurrection of the dead we profess always remains the bedrock of our faith.

It is the unflinching faith in the resurrection that gave the seven brothers we read about in today's first reading-(2 Maccabees 7: 1-2, 9-12) not to compromise their faith in the face of threats to their lives; and one of the brothers at the point of death affirmed, "*you are depriving us of this present life, but the King of the world will raise us to live again forever.*" In line with this exemplary courage of these brothers, St. Paul, in the 2nd reading (2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5), prays that God gives us "*everlasting encouragement and good hope through his grace.*" The Gospel of Luke (20:27-38) also describes the gift of resurrection God gave us through his Son, Jesus Christ, who now counts us as part of the "ones who will rise."

The faith we profess in accepting the gift of resurrection is one step that leads us to manifest the acceptance of this gift through the life we live. Faith, as we know, without good deeds is dead (James 2:17). The challenges we face in our Christian journey are tests of our faith. We win this gift of salvation through our perseverance in faith, which we always profess. In addition, St. Paul encourages us to know "*that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy of being compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us.*" (Romans 8:18). Therefore, let us continue to pray for the persevering grace we need to keep to faith that is active, living, and conscious, which leads us to everlasting life. Amen.

ETERNAL LIFE

What happens after we die? Most religions and philosophies provide some notion of this, but we are confounded by the mystery of it all. Today's readings give us a glimpse through the faith of martyrs and in the words of Jesus. In the Old Testament reading, the Maccabee brothers assert with total confidence that the God who gave them life would also raise them to eternal life. This was not universally accepted in ancient Israel. The Sadducees, who denied any resurrection of the dead, try to trap Jesus with a hypothetical riddle. Jesus, known for turning such things around, dismisses their unbelief, noting that even Moses knew that all are alive in God. Saint Paul tells the Thessalonians that we live in everlasting encouragement and hope, and Psalm 17 echoes this with words of faith that we will see God's face, waking in God's loving presence.

Congratulations to students and families for making the decision to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist, and to 8th graders for embarking on the journey to complete the Initiation as Jesus' disciples through the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Thanks to their parents for encouraging them and helping them to understand how important it is to receive the gift of Sacraments.

We closed our registration for the Sacramental Preparation and Confirmation Programs on November 1. We will celebrate the First Holy Communion for 33 students and Sacrament of Confirmation for 33 students in Spring 2023. We thank the Holy Spirit for guiding them in their discernment process to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit through this Sacrament.

I was born in Indonesia, a country where Islam was the majority religion (87% of population). Thanks to their hard work, my parents (may they rest in peace) were able to send all five of their children to Catholic schools. I don't recall exactly when I was baptized, but I do remember when I received the First Eucharist. All girls wore white dresses and we were excited to finally receive the special 'waffle'.

My preparation process for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation involved going to weekly evening sessions in our parish, which I attended during my High School years. Being part of a minority religion in the country, we were limited in the programs that we could choose to attend. But I do remember looking forward to each Sunday evening session, which gave me opportunities to meet with other friends who would be receiving the Sacrament.

I don't remember how long the process was, nor what lessons were taught in the class, nor the catechists or friends who attended the program. I don't even remember how they conducted the celebration, because at that time, I was just following what my parents asked me to do: receive the Sacrament.

When I reached adulthood and became able to make my own choices, did I ever regret that I sacrificed my time throughout many years for preparing to receive the Sacraments, or complain to my parents for making me do so? Luckily, I didn't. And I never have, and never will. Because I realize that Baptism, the first Sacrament, was the gateway to receiving all the other Sacraments, which in turn were the beginning of my long-standing "relationship" with God. I attended Mass every Sunday without understanding why, just because my mom asked her children to do it. But now I understand that attending Mass was the key to consistently building and maintaining my relationship with Jesus, which now manifests itself powerfully in so many aspects of my life.

When I feel joyful, I can easily express it by saying "Thank you, Jesus!"; when I needed help in going through challenging times, I can just touch my Cross pendant and say, "Please help me, Jesus."

When I am lonely, I can say "I need to feel your presence." When I was worried for my mom's cancer treatment in Indonesia, I could kneel in front of the Tabernacle in St. Justin Church and ask Jesus to send some strength for her. When both my sons graduated from college, I knew to place my gratitude in God for blessing me with children.

I can't imagine if the faith was never planted in me through Baptism; if I was never united with Jesus in the Eucharist, or if I never received the gifts of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation, how would I express all the feelings in my heart? Even though my understanding for these things were developed only later in life, having had faith that the understanding would come has been extremely rewarding in allowing me to express myself through prayer, and thereby obtaining a feeling of peace and strength to overcome problems in my life. I wouldn't even know how to pray if I was never a Catholic. So thank you, mom and dad in heaven! Merry Kaelani
